
2009 LZOX ENM in Latham NY

The Board of Managers for the New England LCOC hosted a Membership Forum on Saturday, May 9, 2009 at the Orzo Trotteria Restaurant at 1085 Osgood Street in North Andover, MA. A social gathering and dinner was held prior to the meeting.

The forum was called to order by Director Charlie Blais at 6:05 PM with all 9 Regional Managers in attendance. Attending were: Director Charlie Blais with member Diana Daniels, Assistant Director Jonathan Rubbo, Treasurer Roger Comire, Secretary Peter Hanson, Managers Frank Daly, Dan O'Grady with wife Susan, Donald Jordan with wife Della, Doug Grant with wife Pam, Jeannie Talbourdet with husband John, LCOC Chief Judge, and members Frank Fitzgerald with wife Nancy and Lee Craig with wife Leah.

An informal round-table type discussion was held regarding a number of possible activities and events for the upcoming months. The idea of Mystery Tours were discussed without any definite event being scheduled at this time. Dan spoke about this year's Second Annual Falmouth Dream Cruise on Cape Cod over Labor Day weekend, September 4-7, 2009. Last year there were 300 cars in attendance.
