The Third Annual Membership Meeting of the New England Region, Lincoln & Continental Owners Club (LCOC) was held on Saturday, October 16, 2010 at the home of Charlie Blais and Diana Daniels in Goshen, NH. Everyone started arriving around noon. The first hour or so was spent socializing, swapping stories

and catching up with old friends, as well as meeting a few new ones.

Everyone then sat down to another one of Lyman's delicious New England Clambakes which featured lobsters, clams in a special sauce prepared by Lyman, corn, steak, and a variety of salads, desserts and beverages.

Director Charlie Blais called the Membership Meeting to order and announced that he, Peter Hanson and Frank Fitzgerald were duly re-elected to new 3-year terms on the Board of Managers. He also introduced Ray Verville, the new editor of our Region's newsletter, the "Lincoln Lighthouse", a name that was chosen at the last Board of Managers on August 8, 2010.

After some announcement about upcoming events, there was considerable discussion regarding our plans to host the 2011 Eastern National Meet on June 2-5, 2011 at The Margate Resort on the shore of Lake Winnepesaukee in Laconia, NH. The meeting was adjourned at 5 PM to take a brief recess before convening a meeting of the Board of Managers.

Director Charlie Blais then called the Board of Managers meeting to order with seven of the Regional Managers in attendance. Attending were: Director Charlie Blais, Treasurer Roger Comire, Secretary Peter Hanson, and Managers, Jeannie Talbourdet, Donald

Jordan, and Frank Fitzgerald. Also present was National LCOE Chief Judge John Talbourdet and former Manager Jim Powers.

As the first order of business, the Board held its annual election of officers for 2011 with the all of the incumbents being re-elected as follows: Charlie Blais, Director; Daniel O'Grady, Assistant Director; Roger Comire, Treasurer; and Peter Hanson, Secretary. Next, Treasurer Roger Comire reported that the current balance on hand is \$1100, and Secretary Peter Hanson gave a brief update on the status of membership.

The Board of Managers meeting was adjourned at 6:50 PM.

Minutes of Board of Managers Meeting

October 16, 2010

Home of Charlie Blais, Goshen, NH

A meeting of the Board of Managers for the New England LCOE was held on Saturday, October 16, 2010 at the home of Charlie Blais and Diana Daniels in Goshen, NH, immediately following the adjournment of the Third Annual Membership Meeting. The meeting was called to order by Director Charlie Blais at 5:02 PM with 7 of the Regional Managers in attendance. Attending were: Director Charlie Blais, Treasurer Roger Comire, Secretary Peter Hanson, and Managers, Jeannie Talbourdet, Donald Jordan, and Frank Fitzgerald. Also present was National LCOE Chief Judge John Talbourdet and former Manager Jim Powers.

Election of Officers:

It was duly noted that all three of the incumbents, Charlie Blais, Peter Hanson and Frank Fitzgerald were re-elected to new 3-year terms on the Board of Managers.

The Board then held its annual election of officers for 2011 with all of the incumbents being re-elected as follows: Charlie Blais, Director; Daniel O'Grady, Assistant Director; Roger Comire, Treasurer; and Peter Hanson, Secretary.

Reports:

Treasurer Roger Comire reported that the current balance on hand is \$1100, and Secretary Peter Hanson gave a brief update on the status of membership.

New Business:

Charlie recommended that James Powers be appointed to serve the rest of the unexpired term on the Board. After a motion by Jeanne Talbourdet that was seconded by Roger Comire, it was voted unanimously to accept such recommendation. (*The unexpired term is for 2-years expiring on 12/31/12*)

Jim mentioned that he is trying to get Bill Leland, the great-grand nephew of Henry Leland, the founder of both Cadillac and Lincoln, to come and speak with us sometime in the near future.

The rest of the meeting was devoted to working on plans to host the upcoming 2011 LCOOC Eastern National Meet in June. Charlie mentioned the need to have some information put together in time for the LCOOC National Board Meeting to be held January 19-22, 2011 just outside of New Orleans in Metairie, LA.

Menu selections were discussed for both the Awards Banquet on Saturday night as well as the Auction Dinner on Friday night. For the banquet, the favored meal choices were Prime Rib @ \$25.95, plus a 9% tax and 20% for gratuity, and Chicken Marsala @ \$21.95, plus tax and gratuity. It was estimated that we could offer the banquet for a cost of about \$34, based on an average cost of \$26 plus 30% to cover the tax and gratuity. It was suggested that we negotiate a price for a vegetarian selection. For the auction on Friday night, it was agreed to offer a plated luncheon instead of a buffet. The favored choices are Lemon Sage Chicken and Pork Medallions with Chili-Maple Sauce which we could offer for a cost of \$22 including tax and gratuity. It was stated that we believe that the Moriah Room, which is our first choice, will be available for both the meal and auction on Friday night.

Charlie discussed the possibility of having
