Jim Roll Honored

Ohio Valley Region member, James Roll, was recently honored by the New Philadelphia, Ohio, Quaker Foundation as as Alumnus of the Year for the Special Achievement Award.



Jim established an upholstery service in 1957 for repairs on cars and commercial vehicles. The business grew quickly and he incorporated it as what it is known today, Tailored Trim, Inc. Jim catered to individuals and clubs by presenting seminars of "how-to" advice and restoration tips for preparing their cars for high level shows and tours. Many of his presentations were published in National & International Trade Journals. In the collector/restorer hobby, the zeniths of this activity are the "Concours d'Elegance" autos. these represent the most valuable and rarest models that demand an uncompromising restoration effort to ultimate standards. They are then shown in world class events for awards in respective classes. Jim Roll's shop has prepared and won awards in all 8 major national concourse events in the U. S. and several in Europe. He presented a special display, the 1939 Prototype Lincoln Continental (personal car of Edsel Ford), at Ford Motor Co.'s 100th anniversary in Detroit in 2003. Jim is a member and advisor for Lincoln Motor Clubs. In 2007, a permanent award, The J. E. Roll Award for Best Interior, was established at the annual Glenmoor Gathering of Significant Automobiles.

Our congratulations, Jim, on another fine accomplishment for your many years of service to the car hobby and to your local community.

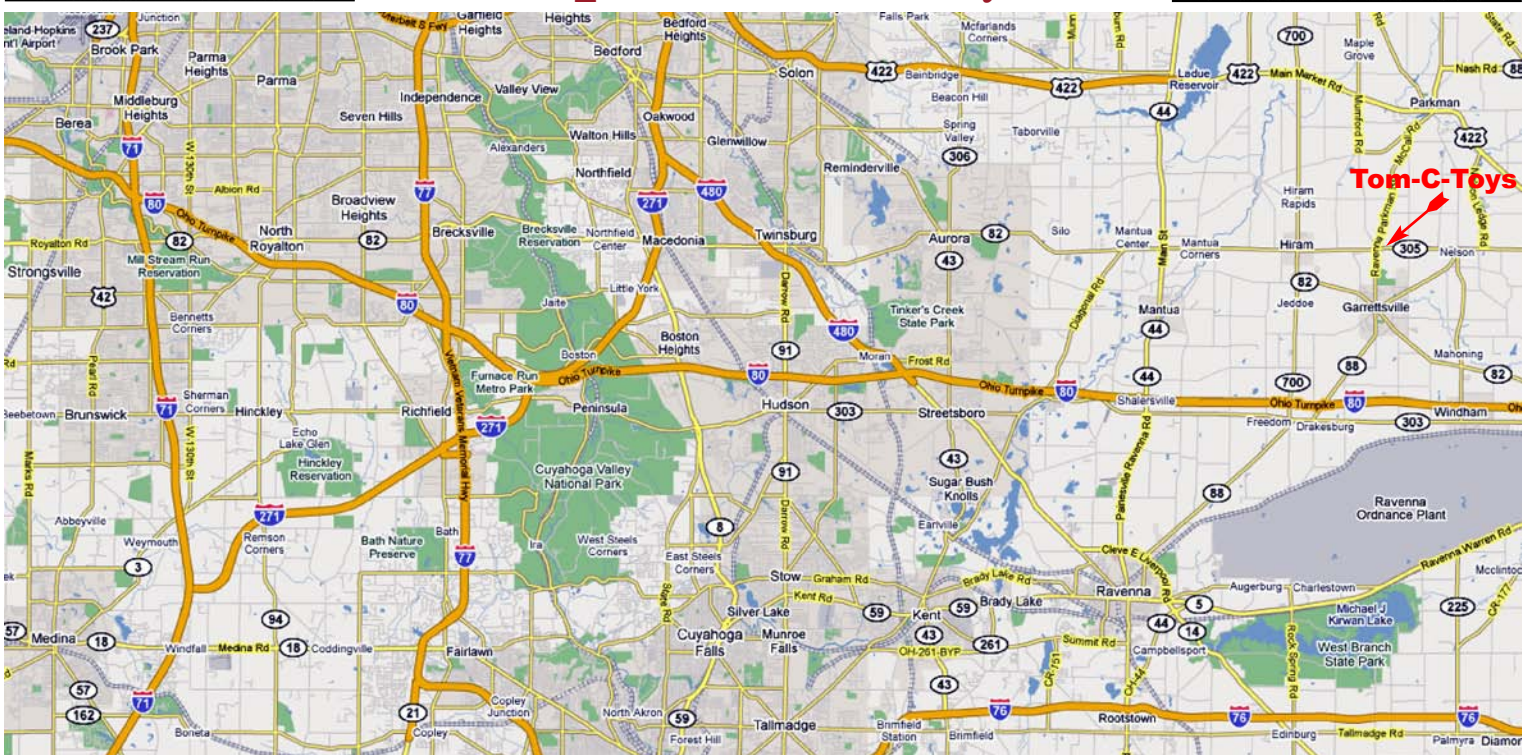

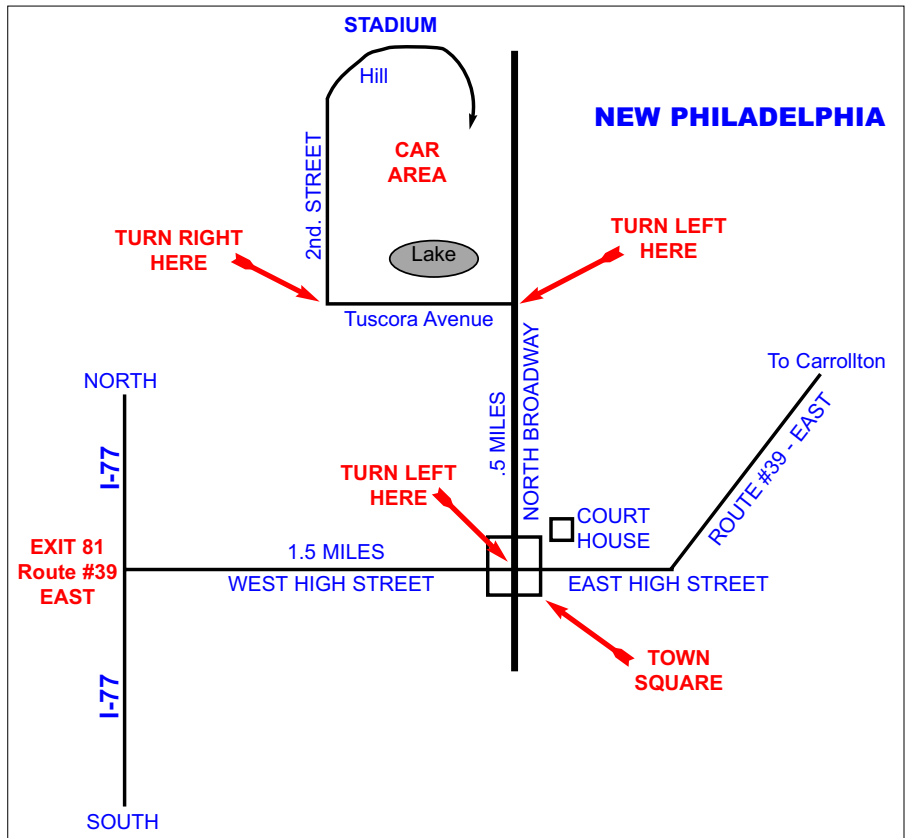
New Philadelphia First Town Days Festival and Car Show
