3. **Matthew C. Murphy of Pittsburgh, Pa. - friend of John Norris. He has a 1971 Mark III Continental.**

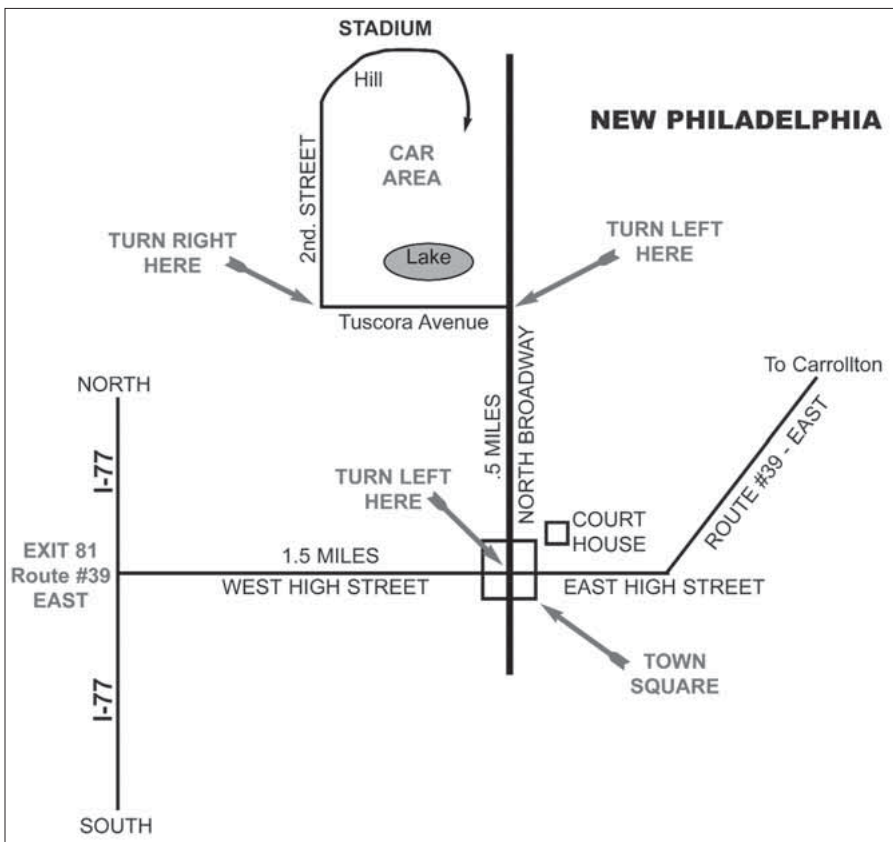
We want to welcome these new members to the club and hope we can meet them at the activities this year.

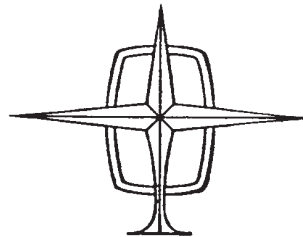
