History Lesson

*Anniversaries that have come and gone since the last edition
of the Continental Star*

February 5, 1952 - Walk/Don't Walk signs for pedestrians were introduced in New York City.

February 6, 1952 - The first pedestrian stupid enough to believe that motorists would obey the sign was flattened in New York City.

February 16, 1852 - Henry and Clement Studebaker founded H & C Studebaker in South Bend, Indiana. They offered blacksmith services and built wagons. Tragically, Clement was run over in 1912 while trying to nail a horse shoe to a Model T.

February 17, 1934 - The first Drivers Ed high school course in State College, Pennsylvania.

February 25, 1919 - Oregon was the first state to tax gasoline—a penny a gallon.

February 26, 1930 - Traffic lights were installed in New York City.

February 26, 1930 - Traffic lights were ignored in New York City.

March 1, 1937 - The first license plates for the purpose of identifying individual vehicles were issued by Connecticut. *(Ed note: This doesn't sound right to me.)*

March 10, 1964 - The first Ford Mustang was produced. (It was introduced to the public in April, 1964.)

March 30, 1947 - Preston Tucker announced that he would produce a radical new car, the Tucker. He would manufacture 51 of them, of which 47 survive

April 1, 1970 - American Motors introduced the Gremlin, the first American sub-compact car. AMC would manufacture 10,000,000,000 of them, of which 47 survive.

April 4, 1923 - Firestone began producing balloon tires (inner tube inside the tire.) That means Firestone also invented the flat tire, which they later perfected.

April 15, 1924 – Rand McNally published its first comprehensive road atlas. Women were thrilled. Men asked, “What’s this for?”

May 12, 1847 - William Clayton invented the odometer. To his friends, William was known as “Rollback Bill.”

Sensational Salado

It was a terrific All Texas LCOC meet in Salado on April 23 and 24! We usually have about 30 cars, but this year we had 40 registered, and some volunteers joined the party. The quality was exceptional. In my opinion, it was the best overall collection of cars I've ever seen in Salado, including the National meet last year.

There were lots of cars we hadn't seen before, including:

- Richard Lucier's low mileage, red 1971 Mark III. We now have two high quality Mark IIIs in the Region.
- A beautiful 1964 sedan in silver that belonged to Gail Remy from Georgetown. I thought it was the top slabside.
- Greg Center's red 1979 Continental Mark V, one of an extraordinary array of Mark Vs.
- Donna Ritterbusch's 1979 Lincoln Continental in its first outing in 15 years.
- Bill Kunowsky's 2000 Lincoln Town Car Signature Series.

Dean and Diana Forbes showed their legendary 1956 Mark II, which appeared for the first time at Salado with a windshield.

Another highlight was Greg Alexander's and Jayson Melanson's 1958 Continental Mark III 4 door sedan, which is now in top condition.

The weekend started with information on the proper motor oil for older style engines. Pat Corbett (Lone Star Region Director) arranged for an expert to speak to members on the subject. Here is my non-technical, non-accurate summary:

Recently, most motor oils stopped including ZDDP (zinc ethylpropolenetriphenolexla.) (I may not have that quite right.) This chemical protects the tappets on old car engines. A ZDDP additive is available, but it isn't very effective unless the chemical is blended in when the oil is refined.

The expert recommends using diesel motor oil or racing oil. Both include ZDDP.

Continuing on the theme of lubrication, we assembled at Doc and Micki Ellis' City Garage for the usual Friday night fest. At the awards ceremony on Saturday, Pat Corbett expressed the appreciation everyone feels for the Ellis' great hospitality over the years.
