Membership Dues for 2023 will be forth coming and more information can be found in this issue along with at our Annual Membership Meeting.

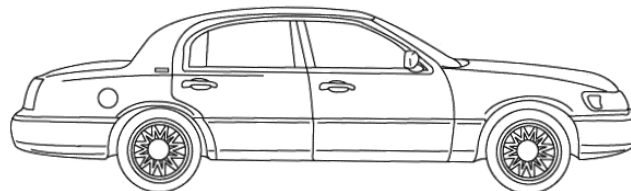
And finally, more information about the upcoming Annual Membership Meeting can be found on page 7.

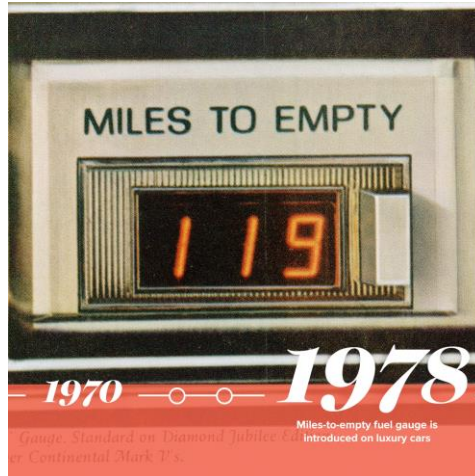
Henry Ford along with his son Edsel purchase Lincoln from Henry Leland.

As we are starting to get in gear for an exciting 2023, it is that time of the year that the LSR is asking that you renew your membership for the upcoming year.

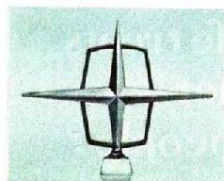

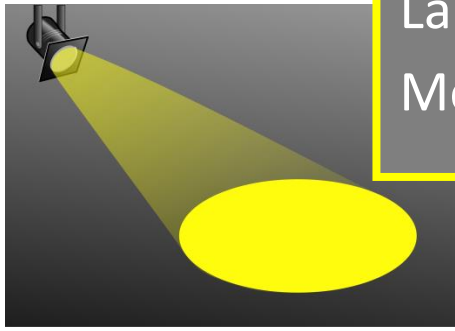

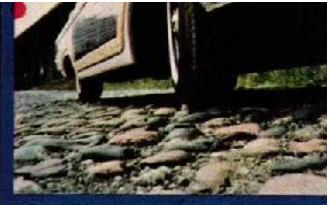
