

t is time to register for the 2023 LCOC Eastern National Meet! The meet will be held at the **Holiday Inn Knoxville West – Cedar Bluff**. The LCOC rate is **\$119.00 per night** and includes breakfast for two. Please follow the link on the LCOC website or call the hotel to make your reservation. *Be sure* to tell them you are a member of the LCOC to get the special rate.

Knoxville has a lot to offer everyone! Downtown, there is the World's Fair Park with the Sunsphere and the exciting Gay Street that is home to many restaurants, shops, breweries, and more! Parking is free at Market Square, State Street, and Locust Street garages, and on meters, from 6:00 p.m. on weekdays. Some of the most visited areas include Market Street, the Waterfront area, and the Turkey Creek shopping area in West Knoxville. There are many beautiful parks, walking trails, attractions, and museums. It is an hour from Pigeon Forge, Gatlinburg, and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Here is a tentative schedule for the meet:

Wednesday, May 31

This is an arrival and check-in day. Registration will be open 2:00-5:00 p.m. The Hospitality Room will serve a light dinner 5:00-9:00 p.m.

The rest of the day is on your own. There are many restaurants and activities in Pigeon Forge. One option for lunch is the Sunliner Diner, a classic 1950s-themed American diner with a beautiful chrome exterior, classic cars, a vintage retail shop, and an interior to match. It is just a half mile south at 2302 Parkway.

Friday, June 2

The day will again begin with a full breakfast at the Holiday Inn. Then a scenic drive to Oak Ridge, Tennessee, where we will experience the "Secret City" of the Manhattan Project. We will then drive to Calhoun's Melton Lake Peninsula for lunch. After lunch, the rest of the afternoon is on your own. There is a judges clinic at 3:30 p.m. at the Holiday Inn. A car wash station is available at the hotel.
